

FIND A WAY

On 29th November 1876, the Georgette left Fremantle for Adelaide. It developed a leak at Calgadup Bay, and became adrift in a rising swell a few kilometres north of the mouth of the Margaret River. A lifeboat was smashed and 2 women and 5 children drowned. Sam Isaacs, an Aboriginal stockman, saw the ship in danger from cliffs overlooking the scene and rode to a nearby homestead for help. 16 year old Grace Bussell returned with Sam and rode her horse down cliffs into the sea to help save people in the last lifeboat. A man was left on the boat and Sam returned to save him. It took 4 hours to land 50 people and all boats engaged in the event capsized. Both Sam and Grace received medals from the Royal Humane Society in 1878.
